

ENA PEREZ LEE is 25 years old and lives in Russell Springs, KY with her husband and twin boys. She works in the day care at our church.

I discovered her in 1998 when she was six years old. Ena was wounded in the arm at age four during a home invasion in which six adult members of her household were killed. We brought her to the states and she was a patient at Shriners Hospital in Lexington, Kentucky where they, through God's grace, performed a miracle on her left arm which was nearly blown off by assault rifle gunfire.

She attended our academy, became a volleyball captain and graduated. Ena attended Johnson Bible College for one year in Tennessee. After a lot of red tape, and a miracle that only God could perform, she became a resident and eventually a citizen of the United States.

I adopted Ena after Mom died in 2007. She is a wonderful mother and wife. She has never let what happened to her keep her from anything in the 19 years here in Kentucky.

"Mom,

There are so many things I miss about you. I miss your gentle hugs and sweet kisses. I miss our weekend trips to Wal-Mart. We enjoyed watching dad's face when we came back with a van full of things.

I am missing my mom more than ever, now that I am a mommy – needing someone to tell me I am doing a good job raising my babies. That I am not messing up too bad.

I hate that my babies are missing out on those moments

with their Mamaw; to sit on your lap and get those big hugs you were famous for with the grand babies.

But, I am who I am because of your loving hands. I have my compassionate heart from watching you with your generosity and kindness to others. I have learned to never give up, even when this world has tried to break me down, because of your drive and perseverance.

You raised me to be a strong woman and to see the good in everything. Even

when sometimes it was hard to see. You have showed me how to love and that everyone deserves to have a chance to be loved and accepted.

me how to be in the ministry and to help people in need. Reaching out and loving the people that world has rejected and showing them compassion and the love of Jesus Christ. I have moved away from the home 12 years ago and live in upstate New York.

I am proud to be like you Mom. We all do take care of Dad and he is still special to me. He is also keeping the promise that he made to you and has not given up. The home is still open and always Faith, Hope and Room for one more. My sweet Mama Sandy, I still have a hard time accepting you are gone. So, I won't and it will be like not seeing each other for awhile, but I understand why God wanted you closer to him, because you were a beautiful angel here on earth. I miss you and I love you.
