Fighting the Good Fight

It is August and with August comes hot weather and pop-up thunderstorms. But it seems that this summer so far has been very hot. In the 90's daily for the past few weeks. It makes me think back to the year of 1979 when we lived on West Kootena Road, near Eureka, Montana and just a stone's throw from the Canadian border. We lived amongst an old order Amish group, they had not been there too long either. Summer time was beautifully hot days, very low humidity and very nice cool nights. Just the opposite of what we have here in south central Kentucky.

But remember in Montana after all the beautifully nice summer and fall weather, comes old man winter. And unlike Kentucky, it gets COLD in Montana. I have seen -34° on the thermometer and that is not with the wind chill factor.

Enough daydreaming, it's time to get back to reality. We have been overly blessed with work teams in June and July. Dawn Shultz, who has been with us for 18 years, schedules the teams so they don't lap over each other. She said that so far we have had six work teams and summer is not over yet. They were from Iowa, Wisconsin, Illinois,

Indiana and Missouri. Some teams might only be two people and then some are larger like the team of 16 that left this morning. We have another four groups coming in August. A lot of work gets done, namely a lot of canning and a lot of construction on the Angel House and other projects around the property.

We really appreciate these teams. Some of them help in the Butchie House with "daycare" as the kids call it...doing arts and crafts, singing, and story time with our residents. Cooks, canners, carpenters, child care and a lot of love is shared from both sides. The children look forward to our work teams. One team leaves and within a day or so or sometimes just hours later, a new team is setting up camp.

Most, but not all, of our teams are from various Amish or Mennonite groups. We have one man who has been coming for many, many years. Often a couple times each year, and at times staying for a week or more. He often brings some of his work crew and on this last trip he brought his wife along. He has been blessings us now for about eight years.

A couple weeks ago we lost one of our major supporters. He lived in Nashville, TN and died from a stroke at a nearby hospital. He was not related to us but all the children called him "Uncle Charlie". He had a big influence on our lives and often referred to the Galilean gang as his family. Being five years older, he was like a big brother to me. I, along with five of our oldest children, were invited to the private funeral service. The church held 2,700 people and it looked to be quite full.

Our plans are still to open school on August 17. But we all know that things can change daily. So plans are always flexible to say the least. The year

2020 will go down in the history books comparing it to the nation during World War II in the 1940's and the great depression in the 1920's and 1930's.

Sometimes I wake up and say am I dreaming or having a nightmare. This problem affects every one regardless of race, gender or financial status. Many businesses had to close their doors for good as a result of the pandemic; mostly restaurants and places that really make a huge impact on our way of living. Unemployment is the highest it has ever been!

Aside from being closed for a few days after all this confusion started, we have been able to keep the Bread of Life Cafe open with some restrictions. But we have such a great crew who work in the Cafe, we have been able to function at nearly 100%. Saturday was our busiest day and we served 622 meals, where before all this started, we would serve 1,000. But all this too will pass. I can't help but think, is this a sign of the times? Time will tell.

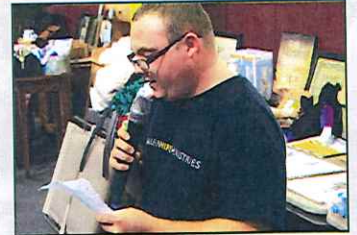
